City Engineer Lou Casolo and Associate Planner Todd Dumais addressed our concerns about Crescent Street improvements at GNA's March meeting.

In November 2011 GNA hosted an audience of 75 for a presentation by Stamford's Housing/Zoning Task Force at Union Memorial Church. Glenbrook Train Station Evolves

A canopy will be installed over the train station platform in 2013. Thanks go to our delegation in Hartford for keeping this project alive, though delayed a year. Because the trees and landscaping along the platform will be removed during construction, GNA has presented a replacement landscape design to ConnDOT. In further train station news, Stamford has received a state grant for a Transit Oriented Development study of the area within a quarter mile radius of the train station. The TOD study will be the subject of one of our quarterly meeting programs in the coming year.

Membership Dues Increase

GNA has raised dues for the first time in our 13-year history. We now pay for plantings that the city used to fund through Keep Stamford Beautiful. Because our only source of income last year was dues and contributions, we did not undertake the kind of special project that the city used to fund through a neighborhood grant program. GNA also has new fixed expenses – a post office box and insurance coverage. Dues are now \$15/household and \$25/ business.
