Glenbrook Talks Trash!

The Whys and Hows of Stamford Recycling

Residents often have questions about the proper way to recycle their garbage, and whether we should even bother to recycle at all. Dan Colleluori, Director of Recycling and Sanitation for the City of Stamford, visited our March GNA meeting to bring us up to date on Stamford's recycling efforts.

For several years now, the only profitable item Stamford can recycle is cardboard. There is no worldwide market for plastics and glass anymore. Recycling does keep items out of landfills and it costs the city less to dispose of recyclables than garbage, so it's still worth doing—especially when it comes to corrugated cardboard.

You can help save the city money by following a few simple rules to speed up recycling collection:

- Make sure your recycling toter contains NO garbage or other non-recyclable items such as grass clippings. Non-recyclables in the toter means the whole thing will not be picked up.
- Do not put plastic bags into your recycling toter. Plastic bags clog up the recycling machine.
- Bring corrugated cardboard to the Katrina Mygatt Center instead of putting it in the toter so Stamford will profit from its sale.
- Compost your yard and food waste at home or bring it to the Katrina Mygatt Center.

Some items must be handled separately, such as appliances, electronics, fluorescent light bulbs, batteries and inkjet cartridges, furniture/bulky waste, cardboard, cooking and motor oil, and textiles. These items can be dropped off at the Katrina Mygatt Recycling Center and sorted into the appropriate bins.

Textiles can be picked up at your home by Helpsy. Just go to the Home Pickup tab at www.helpsy.com or call 800-244-6350 to schedule a pickup. And don't forget about the Take It or Leave It Shop at the Katrina Mygatt Recycling Center. One person's trash is another person's treasure!

Later this year, Stamford will be stepping up its ability to compost food waste with new, app-driven food waste composting machines strategically placed throughout Stamford. Residents will be able to download an app that opens the machines for compost disposal. The machines then turn the food waste into rich soil available to Stamford residents for gardening. Composting food waste helps to lessen the weight of our collected garbage, which also saves the city money.

This decision reflects GNA's dedication to fostering a sense of pride and identity within Glenbrook. Collaborating with local artists Silvia Fernandez-Stein and Jean Benoit, this initiative showcases the power of community-driven efforts to shape the aesthetic and cultural landscape of a neighborhood.

Our newest painted boxes can be spotted at the following locations: Glenbrook Road (across from Stark School), and the intersections of Glenbrook Road & Courtland Avenue, and Maple Tree Avenue & Courtland Avenue.

This year, our quarterly meetings featured programs about:

- Candidates for City-Wide Office who ran in the November 2023 election. We welcomed candidates for Board of Reps. Board of Ed, and Board of Finance.
- The I-95 Planning and Environment Linkages (PEL) Study to research ways to improve safety and mobility on I-95 between exits 7 and 9 in Stamford as well as concepts to replace the I-95 bridge over Metro-North Railroad and Myrtle Ave.
- Changes to the Church Street and Glenbrook Road Intersection from the Department of Traffic, Transportation & Parking.
- Stamford's Vision Zero Initiative, which aims to eliminate fatal and serious traffic crashes in the city by 2032.
- Recycling and Solid Waste Disposal in Stamford with department Supervisor, Dan Colleluori, including how to participate in the food composting initiative.
- Plus updates on business openings and closings, upcoming property development in the area, our local schools, and everything else that's going on in the neighborhood.


